

POS. 1

Drying of diving suits ("dry-suits"), survival suits, chemical protection suits with boots and/or gloves attached.

Very short drying time due to **up-side down positioning** on drying rack **SF01T**.

After inside washing this is recommended.

POS. 2

Drying of various suits in normal position

Drying time a bit longer, but drying perfectly after wearing.

diving suit with AT01LAW hanger:





For suits in over-length or when drying after washing (when the fixed boots are completely soaked) it is recommended to slide up the trouser legs on the hanger for allowing a forced air stream into the boot tips:





(Note: to facilitate the drying process – especially when suits are very wet inside – we advise to first let the suit drip out in an up-side-down position in order to get rid of any excess water.)
